The Institute for Women's Policy Research (IWPR) will celebrate its first 25 years of making research count for women on May 22, 2013, with an afternoon of panels on the current and future status of women in the United States and abroad, followed by a special keynote and reception to kick off the next era of *informing policy, inspiring change, and improving lives*.

### WHY SUPPORT THIS EVENT?

This event will gather key opinion leaders shaping policy from Capitol Hill and the Administration, think tanks, universities, national advocacy organizations, business, and labor. Event supporters will receive recognition for contributing to the lasting impact of IWPR at an event gathering some of the most influential leaders inside the Beltway working on issues important to women and their families.

#### WHY SUPPORT IWPR?

IWPR was founded in 1987 out of a need for a comprehensive, women-focused, policy-oriented research. In what is perhaps the most fundamental of its contributions, IWPR introduced quantitative analysis into the policy debate about women's changing role in the economy, in the workforce, in their families, and in their communities. By conducting rigorous analyses, IWPR shook the assumptions underpinning public debate, replacing rhetoric with hard-to-refute scientific data. From informing successful paid sick days campaigns in San Francisco and Connecticut to making the case to improve wages for nurses and safeguarding Social Security, IWPR has produced real, sustained progress for working women.

Today, in collaboration with its many partners and supporters, IWPR has grown into a research powerhouse producing groundbreaking studies and analyses on how public policies affect women and their families on such issues as the gender wage gap, women's leadership, child care, occupational segregation and discrimination, women entrepreneurs, the glass ceiling, access to higher education and job training, retirement security, and the status of women in the states.
